


Is your mama a llama? Lloyd the baby llama asks his different animal friends in turn.








"Is your mama a llama?" I asked my friend Jane.



"No, she is not," Jane politely explained.




"She's got flippers and whiskers and eats fish all day ... I do not think llamas act quite in that way."





"No, she is not," is how Rhonda responded.




"She's got big hind legs and a pocket for me ... So I don't think a llama is what she could be."


