Such an easy repetition will mean that children will be able to train their counting backwards and have fun storyline. A safety message of not jumping on beds and having fun and learning at the same time is also delivered with the help of rhyme. Children keep being interested in its flowing and predictability and it is exciting due to the entertainment of naughty monkeys. Parents and teachers teach it to enable them to learn subtraction, rhythm and listening. It also promotes the use of memory and group participation, as children are eager to find out what will happen next. Five Little Monkeys is not merely a math rhyme, it is a lesson of responsibility and consequences, which is delivered in an easy to comprehend way, so it makes it a popular rhyme in the early learning classroom.
